1990s: New Technology Brings New Crime

- The world goes online
- Mostly hobbyists and enthusiasts
- Objective Fame & Prank
- Loses estimated: tens of millions







2000s: Cybercrime ramps up

- Monetization Era
- Crime begins to get Organized
- Loses estimated over 100 billion









2010s: An Explosion of Cyber Attacks

- The Ransomware Era
- Cybercriminal groups organize together
- Nation sponsored hackers
- Loses broke the trilliondollar mark









2020s: Billions of Dollars Lost

- Ransomware fully Develops
- Now the 3rd largest global economy
- Critical infrastructure is now a target for ransomware
- Estimated to be 10.5 Trillion annually
